State Update

Governors Commission meeting 8/24/11. There were 70 individuals supporting 26 cities in attendance. The commission stated that no decision had been made as of yet and another meeting is set for September 28th. However, they did say that in the absence of a community consultant – ICJI would make sure that

each county is knowledgeable with the Comprehensive plan, review of Indiana code and know the ins and outs updating the plan.

Drug Free Communities Mentoring Program

This program funded by the SAMSHA, Office of National Drug Control Policy and Center for Substance Abuse.

The purpose is to provide grant funds to existing DFC grantees, so they may serve as mentors to newly formed and/or developing coalitions that have never received a DFC grant.

The program application is due in April.

The cost is \$75,000/year for up to two years (1:1 match required)

The Program Goals are to strengthen mentee coalition's organizational structure. Increase mentee coalition's leadership and community readiness to address youth substance use problems in the community. Assist the coalition in working through strategic planning process that will result in a comprehensive community action plan.

Tobacco Coordinator Update –

Raising funds for billboards between Parke and Vermillion Counties – on Lyford Curve. The Health Department has granted money for billboard, VOICE and TAR WARS projects.

Michelle has VOICE meetings at SVHS with 12 attending. (Possible group at MS soon)

The Head start and WIC initiative are under way – training and working with parents on secondhand smoke education.

Michelle attended the middle school open house – several students stopped by the booth and spoke with parents about quitting.

QUIT now contest is underway to win \$2500.00, \$1500.00 or \$1000.00 – you can sign up online and must quit for at least the month of October.

This next 2 year grant cycle will bring about working on educating policy makers about clean air ordinances at the local level, so be prepared – we will have to pull together on this one.
